Use the grid above to see when your child may be eligible for a nursery place.

Please note that being eligible does not always mean there is a space at your chosen nursery.

If there are more applications than spaces, we will apply the admissions criteria.

### **Admissions criteria:**

If there are more applications than places available, we will apply the admissions criteria below to decide which applicant gets priority.

Children in a lower priority group will not be offered a place unless all the children in the group, or groups higher, have been offered.

Group 1: Children who will have only one term in nursery before starting primary school (reception class)

Group 2: Children who will have only two terms in nursery before starting primary school (reception class)

Group 3: Children who will have only three terms in nursery before starting primary school (reception class)

And so on: 4 terms at nursery, 5 terms at nursery, 6 terms at nursery, etc. etc.

In each of the above groups if there are more children than places available we admit in the order below:

Priority 1: Children who live locally and have a sibling on roll at the school

Priority 2: Children who do not live locally but have a sibling on roll at the school

Priority 3: Children who live elsewhere in Newham and have a sibling at the school

Priority 4: Children who live elsewhere in Newham but do not have a sibling at the school

Priority 5: All other children

If a decision has to be made between children in one of the groups, a place is given to the child who lives nearest to the school by walking distance.

If there are any places remaining, then these are offered to other children using the criteria above.

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**Please note: we are not registered for children UNDER 2 years of age.**
